He previously served as counsel for the U.S. Senate Committee on Indian Affairs, where he worked on landmark federal legislation, such as VAWA and the HEARTH Act, with a particular focus on natural resource development on federal and Indian lands. Daniel grew up in Pawhuska, Oklahoma, the heart of the Osage Indian Reservation, and is an enrolled member of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, a federally recognized Indian Tribe. He serves as Vice Chair of the Greater Tulsa Area Indian Affairs Commission, which is a group of Native American community leaders appointed to advance Native

American culture, services and relations within the Tulsa community.
